### Presidents Report

G'day and welcome to the first issue of FLATCHAT for 2022, I hope you are all keeping well. Unlike 2020/21 2022 is looking really busy for Classic racing with so many events here and interstate.

The events we have booked in are:

- Eddington Sprint 26/3 (Closed to club).
- Victorian Historic Road Race Championships - 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> of April (Open Road Race)
- Historic Winton 28<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup> of May (Open Road Race
- Mt Tarrengower Hill climb -15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> of October (Closed to club)

This year's Southern Classic (November 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup>) clash's with the Australian Historic Championships at Morgan Park Qld. HMRAV applied for these date back in October last year and was given the green light Morgan Park were given separate dates but had them moved to our weekend.

Important notice about Winton there was some confusion over whether the meeting would be run due to MA not licensing the track due to safety concerns. MA has met with Winton management and has come up with a plan to rectify the issues at hand.

These works should be completed by the end of April. Sup regs for Eddington and Vic Titles are now on

our web site and Winton to follow shortly.

All our meetings are COVID-Safe events and all Victorian Government protocols under COVID regulations and under COVID guidelines of MA will be in place and must be adhered to by all.

At our first General meeting on the 10<sup>th</sup> of Jan we had a guest who spoke about historic racing and not wanting to include later periods, (P6 and P7) cut off at P5. (This is actually what HMRAV currently does). He wanted support from HMRAV in putting a submission to the Historic Management Commission to not include anything after Period 5. Discussion took place. We would get his bike out which was a Honda SL70 with a Hodaka 100 motor in it. We would push it up the drive way and out onto his street, we had to be quite at this stage.

Then we would turn the fuel on and start kicking it until it fired, He always had the first run up and down the street, if there was a muffler of any sort it didn't really do anything. So pretty soon everyone in the street knew what was going on.

He would come back to the starting point and we'd swap then I'd take off. Now if we were lucky I'd get back to his place and we'd do another rider change, if we weren't his mum would come out and start yelling at us to "put that bloody things away!"

At which point we'd turn the bike off and roll it back away with huge grins on our faces.

Now with no helmets, only our school uniforms on, riding an unregistered bike, being unlicenced and being on public but her only concern seemed to be the noise we were making!

It was fast, noisy, fun and a bit wrong. Basically everything that makes an experience memorable.

Regardless of how your adult life turns are now. As primary school kids we would out I think we are all part of an inner circle of shared experience and that 's what makes a motorcycle racer.

## **Club Permits**

Attention all Club Permit members.

The club has hundreds of members with Club Permits (Red Plate) which means there are hundreds of renewals to process by members of our volunteer committee.

To ensure that your renewal application is processed, you must include the following along with your renewal notice from Vic Roads:

- You must send a photocopy of your current membership card to show that you are a FULL financial member of HMRAV (Racing and Red Plate member only Social membership does not entitle members to Red Plate privileges). This is essential and a Vic Roads requirement for red plate renewals. (In regards to family membership, It is important that each person who is part of that family membership, is known to the club and has been allocated a membership card)
- You must send a stamped, self-addressed envelope to ensure that your renewal gets back to you in a timely fashion and arrives at the right address.

Failure to adhere to these conditions will mean that we can't process your renewal and will lead to delays and frustration for all concerned.

If you have any questions please call our Club Permit coordinator Mick Chegwidden on 0401 819 609 who is only too happy to give you advice.

The Club Permit scheme is one of the great things about belonging to a club like HMRAV, so please ensure you are supporting the club by getting your renewal processes right the first time.
