

A weekend at Eastern Creek

A weekend at Eastern Creek, sidecar racing. Race engines humming; ready and staged in grid formation. I sat crouched, on the passenger's, (swinger) platform, hands gripping support bars and head tucked in tight, waiting for the green flag to signal our take off.

My breath huffed out a rhythm that I fought to keep under control as John, the rider of the Period 4 class Honda DeWith 960 sidecar outfit I was swinging on, started revving the engine. A low thrum rumbled through me; a thunderous tune began and the wheels spun. My helmet filled with a rubbery stench as we became mobile, and shot off the start line Go together nicely

We were at Eastern Creek's, Sydney Motorsport
Park. Racing down the straight amongst the pack
of other outfits, at a pace too quick to register,
each passenger swung to the left, bracing for the
first sweeping corner. I pulled myself forward and
over the front left of the platform as we curved into the
lefthander. It's a feeling like no other, something almost
inexplicable, to be centimetres from the bitumen,
travelling at speeds of around 160/170kph. I felt both
incredibly alive and yet so close to death.

We levelled out of the first corner and barrelled down a small straight, my head pressed as far down as I could tuck it to avoid the gravitational forces pushing against me. This only gave mere seconds of relief as I was forced to haul myself over the front left, again, as we changed down a gear, then another to spin back on ourselves in a tight lefthand hairpin - one of two hairpins in the track.

I tried to recall how to breathe, how to push air into my lungs as I hung over the front. Whilst processing which corner came next and what position I had to be in. It was a cognitive struggle amidst the chaos of physical exertion. Then, the next corner was upon us, and I was up and over the back of John; throwing my weight to the right, as we took on an immediate righthand turn. And so, it went lap after lap around the track. I raced.

Thinking only of the immediate and just when I thought I couldn't take any more, that my arms would give out, we passed the checked flag and slowed into the final bend. I waved at the marshals, engulfed in a static buzz of exhilaration.



Road Race Sidecar racing is unlike anything I've ever experienced. I first heard about it from my mechanic Craig, who's been sidecar racing for over 20 years. I couldn't quite believe my ears.

"So, you're saying you race around a track and hang out the side of a motorcycle that has a little platform attached to it?"

However, my incredulity was short-lived. Yes, I was shocked that something this wild had been dreamed up and was an actual sport, but my intrigue was stronger. Craig suggested I attend an Introduction Day, which is put on every year in Broadford, by the Sidecar Racing Club of Victoria. I went in December of 2022, jumping on the back of several sidecar outfits. A sidecar used for road racing is defined as a three-wheeled motorcycle that has an engine either behind, (for Formula 1 and 2,) or underneath, (periods 3, 4, and 5,) the rider in front and a small rear platform, which the swinger moves around on, helping to distribute the weight of the sidecar through the corners.

A weekend at Eastern Creek

After spending the day racing the Broadford track, I was hooked. I was enthralled by this niche sport and excited at the prospect of pursuing it, which is how I ended up swinging for John at Eastern Creek.

Eastern Creek was an intense three days of physical and mental exertion, from the 17th to the 19th of February 2023. Three exceedingly hot days; I can't say I've sweated more in my life. Pulling on and off leathers, gloves, boots and a helmet repeatedly in 37-degree heat was by far the most significant challenge of the weekend.

The pits were a continual buzz of excited activity, which I was warmly welcomed into. It wasn't what I had expected, though I'm not entirely sure what pre-perceived image I'd had in mind.

Everyone was eager to introduce themselves, pass on advice and have a yarn about their past racing experiences, never leaving out the scary details which I appreciated. I've never done anything this openly dangerous before and was aware that my perception of the sport could quite easily become romanticised.

The reality is this sport is hazardous and that is something exceedingly valuable to grasp. Something that everyone in the pits made sure I understood; not in a way to scare me off, but rather to educate me. Educate me that every time I leave the pits, I'm embracing something undoubtedly perilous which can result in a severe or fatal injury.

Remembering that is what I strove to do amid the euphoric rush I felt throughout the weekend.

Steve, who has been swinging for several years, said something about his time racing at the Isle of Man TT, that stuck with me. Every time he left to race there was an unspoken understanding that he might not come back, so the competitors would all shake the hands of their pit crew.

Yet, this sombre reality didn't alter the atmosphere in the pits which was light-hearted and jovial. The sidecar

community is a tight-knit bunch of playful people. I was pleasantly astounded at the banter between them. They have a fantastic rule: If the passenger comes off without a handle in their hand, they have to buy a slab and if they come off with a handle, it's the rider's fault.

If the rider comes off, they have to buy two slabs.

Something yet to be carried out by a couple of passengers from the weekend, who grumpily assured me it was not their fault that they'd come off. It was around this point in the weekend that I discovered the comedic rivalry between the passenger and rider. The most practical advice I got all weekend was the simplest. Other passengers, whom I came to know as a crazy bunch, all told me the same three rules:

- Don't let go
- Remember to breathe, and
- Don't forget to enjoy it.

That may sound like three easy things to accomplish, but whilst transferring your body weight in a graceful waltz around a sidecar platform that's moving at high speeds, they can easily be forgotten.

Throughout the weekend, I completed six races, including two feature races, one with a poor handicap start which turned into a chaotic delight. Chaotic because in a handicapped race, the fastest starts last and the slowest first. Each outfit set off at a calculated number of seconds after the other.

For my first race meeting, John and I walked away with a first for our Period 4 class and a neat lap time of 1.59.92.

I arrived back in Melbourne after the monumental weekend still awash with an energetic intoxication I knew I wouldn't be able to shake and already preparing for my next race.

To ensure that your renewal application is processed, you must include the following along with your renewal notice from Vic Roads:

- You must send a photocopy of your current membership card to show that you are a FULL financial member of HMRAV (Racing and Red Plate member only Social membership does not entitle members to Red Plate privileges). This is essential and a Vic Roads requirement for red plate renewals. (In regards to family membership, It is important that each person who is part of that family membership, is known to the club and has been allocated a membership card)
- You must send a stamped, self-addressed envelope to ensure that your renewal gets back to you in a timely fashion and arrives at the right address.

Failure to adhere to these conditions will mean that we can't process your renewal and will lead to delays and frustration for all concerned.

If you have any questions please call our Club Permit coordinator Mick Chegwidden on 0401 819 609 who is only too happy to give you advice.

The Club Permit scheme is one of the great things about belonging to a club like HMRAV, so please ensure you are supporting the club by getting your renewal processes right the first time.
