Bike Build

Story Peter Gaefield



The story of getting a GT250 Suzuki back on the track. New committee member Peter Garfield shares his experience of finding an historic race bike and getting it back on the track.

At the height of the Covid pandemic in 2021, on a winter's day where Victoria was about to go into another painful lockdown, I bought a motorcycle. The little blue Suzuki was a year shy of fifty years old and looked very neglected. The carbies were hanging off on their cables due to perished intake rubbers. Mud wasp nests plugged the cylinder fins and pine needles filled the cavities around the crankcase's. The tyres were hard and flat. The seat had been branded where a piece of

R. Bringing all my road bikes to the Come and Try days and hanging out of an outfit was great fun even if the huge G forces of Mick Alton's F2 gave me motion sickness.

Stripping my Ariel Red Hunter down for the Mt Tarrengower hill climb in 2019 was a hoot and despite something falling off on every run and losing third gear I had a great time. I knew that making a race bike out of her or my plunger framed B31 would be an expensive journey so I eventually sold them and started looking for something with a bit more promise.

The ad for the Suzuki turned up on Bookface only a few months later.

It wasn't far from my in-laws house so on a weekend visit to see them, as chairman Dan was about to shut the place down, I picked up the Suzuki. Back at the in-laws I started sifting through all the spares thinking that if I couldn't get it going I could get something back from the purchase.

Back at home I started searching on social media for the original owner. I had bought the bike off his brother who inherited it from his parents garage. Mick had left it with them to tour overseas with Kenny Blake but he never came back to Victoria. Looking through the classic racing pages I soon found him. His amazement that his brother hadn't sold it years before turned to joy when I told him of my plans to get it back on the track.

MikuniOz had already supplied me with a pair of new intake rubbers. I'd pumped up the Michelin PZ4 tyres which still held air, cleaned the fuel system, and soaked

the chain long enough to get it back on.

Mick was a mine of information for someone like me who didn't have much experience. This despite not having ridden the bike for nearly forty

years!

One Saturday morning as my friend Kelvin primed the carbies I gently kicked her over and on the second kick she fired and ran for the first time in over three decades.

I rode her around the back yard with no front brakes. Mick and I corresponded for months with him sharing stories of his racing adventures as well

reinforcement mesh had lain on it for a very long time. Every piece of chrome was rusty and all the aluminium that wasn't covered in grease was corroded.

What sold me was the remains of the square blue racing number plate hanging off the front by one bolt and the white letter C on the top right corner. I'd found a race bike. It came with old tired boxes of spare parts and factory tools that had been shunted around the state with the bike. On the positive side it had alloy rims, Koni shocks and an intact set of chambers. I couldn't wait to part with my cash and get it on the trailer.

This was my first race bike and I didn't have a clue what I was doing!

I've been involved with HMRAV since 2018. My first taste of racing was helping with the recovery vehicle for the Southern Classic that year. I was in heaven being right on the track watching the action and breathing in Castrol

as providing information on setting up the bike. At the time Specs: he was dealing with some serious health issues and his wife has credited this project for helping his recovery. Mick also sent me a trophy that he won in the Intervarsity challenge 500cc class at Hume Weir in 1976. I'm looking forward to catching up with him in person next time I'm in Queensland.

Over the next year I spent many hours stripping and rebuilding the bike. Our first track day was in June 2022 at Broadford and with the Vic titles, Eddington Sprints, and one day of Winton behind us things couldn't be better!

As much as I've enjoyed volunteering for the club it's been great to get onto the track. I'm not keen to modify the bike much but to leave it as is and as a novice on the track it suits me just fine.



I'm David Betteridge and have been a member of the HMRAV club for at least 15 years. I ride the Norton Sidecar 942 with my wife Rebecca. It's been great to get back out on the track and race this year, especially at Broadford and Winton.

Have you noticed the new paint job and artwork on our sidecar this year? We are proudly supporting The Black Dog Institute, by raising awareness for Mental Health and Suicide Prevention.

I'm off taking part in a trek to Kokoda in November 2023, the weekend after the Southern Classic, as

finished, until he met this man "The Story Teller". It was very clear this had and still affected The Story Teller. The emotion that he shared in telling me this story was moving.

This is partly why I have joined The Black Dog Kokoda challenge.

Like many of you, I know of family members or friends that have been affected in some way by mental health, but if I can reach people that I may never meet, could make the biggest difference. I'm proud to say that I will be joining The Story Teller in this Kokoda challenge, participating in a group of four mates.

1 in 5 of us will experience symptoms of mental illness in any given year.

In Australia that's around 5 million people. And roughly 60% of these people won't seek help. Black Dog is the only medical research institute in

Australia to investigate mental health across the lifespan.

Mental Illness does not discriminate.

Our fund raising efforts have seen us hold Rock the Black Dog concert in Geelong earlier this the year, which was a huge success with a vast range of many local businesses coming on board to support our cause. We have had auctions for goods and vouchers, sold entertainment books with part of the proceeds being donated, held a Bunning's Sausage Sizzle and even a Golf trip to Tuncurry, who are big supporters of The Black Dog Institute where they held a day for auctions and raised money and awareness.

Funds raised will enable more health professionals to be trained, increase understanding in the community about mental health issues, illnesses, signs and symptoms. Reduced stigma toward mental health in the community as well as increased access to information and resources about mental health and wellbeing.

Attention all Club Permit members.

The club has hundreds of members with Club Permits (Red Plate) which means there are hundreds of renewals to process by members of our volunteer committee.

To ensure that your renewal application is processed, you must include the following along with your renewal notice from Vic Roads:

- You must send a photocopy of your current membership card to show that you are a FULL financial member of HMRAV (Racing and Red Plate member only Social membership does not entitle members to Red Plate privileges). This is essential and a Vic Roads requirement for red plate renewals. (In regards to family membership, It is important that each person who is part of that family membership, is known to the club and has been allocated a membership card)
- You must send a stamped, self-addressed envelope to ensure that your renewal gets back to you in a timely fashion and arrives at the right address.

Failure to adhere to these conditions will mean that we can't process your renewal and will lead to delays and frustration for all concerned.

If you have any questions please call our Club Permit coordinator Mick Chegwidden on 0401 819 609 who is only too happy to give you advice.

The Club Permit scheme is one of the great things about belonging to a club like HMRAV, so please ensure you are supporting the club by getting your renewal processes right the first time.


