Both car and motorbike competitors provided excellent entertainment over the weekend, although the weather certainly put on a wet finish on Sunday. Until late Sunday the weather was fine - the decision to have only 2 bike runs instead of the usual 3 was a wise one!

There was close contention in times between Stacey Heaney and Ken Mundy in the honour of claiming King of the Mountain - only .2 seconds between these two, and with Wayne Donehue so close behind them! This honour ultimately was awarded to Stacey, Queen of the Mountain. Ken took out the fastest Red Plate trophy from Wayne in the final timing run.

A warm welcome was extended to Mt Tarrengorwer newcomers Winston Wyatt, Brian Gray, Ian McDonald, Tim Marshall, David Bunnett and sidecar passenger Marc Greaves, also two sidecar teams Bill Hargrave with Annie Tregger (from WA) and Ray Smith with Mandy Smith. Unfortunately there were quite a few withdrawals due to bike problems - David Bunnett did not even manage a practice; Ian McDonald, Tim Marshall, Mason Birthisel and Ray & Mandy Smith managed Saturday practice but no runs on Sunday; and Brian March had bike problems from the very start of the meeting as did Trevor Spiers - hopefully things will be sorted for next year's hill climb! Well done to Brian Gray who took home the P2 Up To 500cc trophy. Des Heaney had only one run for the P3 trophy but had the fastest time over Dave Philpots and Martin Gratton. Rob Matheson had the fastest time in the P4 Up To 350cc class, followed closely by Pete Garfield.

Pete Large and Ben James were awarded the fastest P3 sidecar time, with Bill and Annie not far behind them. Don Cooke & Marc Greaves ran the fastest time for the P4 sidecar class in front of Tony Peters and Matt Morgan.

The Elder-Brown award was presented to Clint Chegwidden, who also won the P2 750cc and Unlimited trophy. Rob Liddicoat was the recipient of the President's Choice Award. A huge congratulations goes out to all our competitors!

Sincere thanks to Vic O'Driscoll as Steward of the meeting, Toddy as Clerk of Course, Marg as Race Secretary, Eric Saunders and Mike Cheg for scrutineering, and also a big thank you to our new HMRAV President Phill Watson for presenting the trophies.

# Collingrove Hillclimb

### COLLINGROVE HILLCLIMB ANGASTON SA 17/9/23

Doghouse and I love hill climbs! Mt Tarrengower is one of our favourite events and we're always on the lookout for more. We've known about the Collingrove Hill climb for years but it's always clashed with things like the annual Townsville race trip and major gigs for Doghouse. This year with a few unexpected changes of plans the hill climb on the 17/9 suddenly became a reality.

With Mick Cheg joining in on the fun we loaded up for the big road trip to the Barossa. Three vans, three hand shifters, one Triumph and one KTM...we were packed and good to go.

It's a fair old drive to the Barossa, 750k's from my place. Add an hour for Doghouse and another two for Mick and that's a big day in anyone's language. We made the trek over with no dramas, found our motel in Angaston and hit the pub for a great counter meal.

Next day after a lazy breakfast in town, we headed out to the track to set up. Situated 10 minutes from Angaston, the hill climb is a permanent course with onsite buildings for scrutineering, a canteen and even a bar with decking overlooking the start line. The course also has a return road so you can run multiple bikes. We set up on the grass that was the pits, next to a bitumen road that led to the start line. We were pitted next to Paul Dempsey, a fellow racer from SA, who had entered his beautiful and very well-prepared Norton and Triumph twins.

Scrutineering and sign on were trouble free which gave us plenty of time for an exploratory track walk. Well....let me just say that on first "walk" of the track we were a little concerned. With ups and downs, tight banked corners and a ribbon of bitumen about 8 foot wide, we were wondering what we'd gotten ourselves into! It was going to be a hoot that's for sure.

Sunday was raceday and we got out to the track nice and early. It all started with solo sighting laps, which



Doghouse and I managed to do on both our bikes.

Then we were into it.

With 55 bikes entered for the meeting, we ran in race number order. With our bikes that meant 12,22,72,122 and 475. It's amazing how quickly your number comes up and your back out there. It actually seemed to speed up as the day went on too.

We were loving the track and it's amazing how focussed you get...no thoughts whatsoever of the narrow track and the 1 foot drop off the bitumen in some spots. No, it was head down bum up and twist that throttle! In total,

with our 5 bikes, we managed 35 runs for the day. Now that's value for money!

Presentation was a laidback affair and everyone received a certificate noting their fastest time. A nice touch. Amazingly after 5 runs each, there was only one second separating our three hand shifters. Incredible considering how tight and twisty the course was, the differences in our bikes and the fact that none of us had seen the track before.

We spent our last night in Angaston having a feed of fish and chips and a few beers. We'd had a great day and all the bikes had run well. In fact, we hadn't put a spanner on any of them. There was also lots of talk about the course, how much fun we'd all had and of course....plans for next year.

The trip home was long but uneventful. One thing that did become quite clear though was next time we'll split the drive in half....no need to rush.

So, after what seems like a decade of trying to get over for the Collingrove Hill climb, we'd finally done it. It was a really well run meeting, great friendly club (Atujara MCC),



awesome course and a perfect event to run a classic bike in. I did take my KTM RC390 over as a spare but to be honest I had more fun racing my Indian. We competed at an "open" event, so it included moderns, motards etc but there was a fair sprinkling of classics and all were welcome.

There was a "classic" hill climb scheduled for a couple of weeks later but we couldn't make it to that one. I didn't feel any pressure being on a classic and there was a really good mixture of bikes, (and sidecars).

Would we do it again....you betcha! Hope some more of you make the effort and join us next year.

Attention all Club Permit members.

The club has hundreds of members with Club Permits (Red Plate) which means there are hundreds of renewals to process by members of our volunteer committee.

To ensure that your renewal application is processed, you must include the following along with your renewal notice from Vic Roads:

- You must send a photocopy of your current membership card to show that you are a FULL financial member of HMRAV (Racing and Red Plate member only Social membership does not entitle members to Red Plate privileges). This is essential and a Vic Roads requirement for red plate renewals. (In regards to family membership, It is important that each person who is part of that family membership, is known to the club and has been allocated a membership card)
- You must send a stamped, self-addressed envelope to ensure that your renewal gets back to you in a timely fashion and arrives at the right address.

Failure to adhere to these conditions will mean that we can't process your renewal and will lead to delays and frustration for all concerned.

If you have any questions please call our Club Permit coordinator Mick Chegwidden on 0401 819 609 who is only too happy to give you advice.

The Club Permit scheme is one of the great things about belonging to a club like HMRAV, so please ensure you are supporting the club by getting your renewal processes right the first time.
