Very close times were attained across all the classes with close competition during the day - well done to all of our competitors, and for helping to make the day run smoothly.



2024 Carnell Classic

I make no qualms about my love for racing up in QLD. We've been racing there for more years than we can remember, the tracks are tight and twisty and a couple of the organising clubs contain some of the friendliest people you can meet.

What's not to love?

Recently we had the chance to head on up to Stanthorpe and compete in the Carnell Classic run by the good folks of QEMSC. The classic and the big chill, (run in July) take place at a great little circuit called Carnell Raceway. It's located about 2 minutes drive from Stanthorpe, is about 1km long and has 5 beautifully crafted and banked corners.

I've raced solos and sidecars at the venue and whilst the track's not big it certainly is technical and rewards carrying good corner speed. For the last few years I've just raced my Indian handshifter and Leanne has run her Gilera in the regularity/non-competitive sections, (another cool part of the event).

We just pack the van and leave the trailer behind. It free's us up to sightsee a bit whilst traversing the New England area and even across roads like Thunderbolt's Way over to the north coast of NSW.

We always incorporate an overnight stay in Uralla. Dinner at the famous "top pub" and breakfast at the "alternate root café" are a must.

Travelling up with us this time were Noel and Corina Fernando. Noel's raced his sidecar at Carnell once before but this was his first time racing his Indian. Corina had never been on a road trip as big as this one so we made sure to stop at some of the more interesting sights and do the touristy bit.

There were 5 of us running handshift Indians this year: Tim Hewitt from Townsville, Gary Ellis from Hervey Bay, Mick Petith from Sydney, Noel and myself from Melbourne. This year we had 8 period 2's entered, The 5 handshift Indians, 1 BSA, 1 Velo and 1 Norton....so we were separated from the p3's and had our own races. This was a great result as the meeting combines historics, moderns and motards and 8 p2 entries is better than some "all historic" events.

Popular racer, Gary Ellis, is known in handshift circles as the "flying mullet" (for obvious reasons). at riders briefing when Gary's name was called during roll call, we had about 6 "Gary's" resplendent with 2 foot long mullet wigs all answer. It was hilarious and no one laughed more than Gary. Afterwards all those racing from our pit chopped up a piece of the wigs, stuck it to the back of our helmets and raced....mullets flowing in the breeze!

Practice and qualifying went off without a hitch. All the handshifters were running well but unfortunately the Velo succumbed to some engine issues. The Norton was the ES2 that Fraser McMillan used to own and race. David Woolsley was racing it but the bike was actually for sale. One of our crew was very interested and eventually bought the bike. So that meant the Norton was now removed from the competition. That left us with 6 bikes in the class....a lone BSA vs 5 Indians.

We had two races on Saturday and it was close all through the field. the BSA managed to win both after a few passing moves and some very skillfull riding by it's owner, Guy Vicary. Guy's a great bloke and loves it when we come up to race with him. I've had some tough battles with him over the years and trust him 100%.

After raining all night, Sunday turned into a dull and

drizzly day. A lot of people were pulling out and packing up. it didn't seem that bad to us, (It wasn't as bad as the rain at the Vics) so we thought we'd give it a crack.



With that we headed out for our races. It really wasn't too wet and to be honest the track is pretty grippy. Once we did our warm up laps the track felt fine. times were down as no one wanted to bin it, so a few hand gestures later and we bunched up and started to "dice". Our pit crews could see what was going on but the rest of the crowd apparently were unaware. Leanne reckoned people were cheering and clapping with one lady telling us they were the best races of the weekend! We all

had a bit of a laugh and some of the efforts to not actually pass were as good as the actual passing moves.

One of the best parts of the Carnell Classic and the big chill are the regularity/non compettive runs. You get out on track about half a dozen times over the weekend and it's pretty much a run what you brung type of thing aimed at novices wanting to try riding on a track. Race bikes and racers are not allowed and passing on corners is discouraged. It's a great thing to have a go at and it allows entrants to try out the track and get a better understanding of what the racers are doing.

One of our Qld friends, Kerry Hill, rides her Adler in the non-competitive section and last year Leanne joined her on her Gilera. They both went out there again this year and they had a ball. Kerry has been part of our pit for a couple of years now and joins in on all our social activities, (of which there are many!).

Each night after racing saw us at one of Stanthorpe's many pubs for a counter meal and lots of laughs. Plenty of stories of the "old" days had us all cracking up. Kerry's description of how she started a brawl at the Gurga Creek concert was memorable and not at all expected. The social side of racing... sharing good times with mates is what it's all

about isn't it?



Monday we all packed up, said our good byes and started the trek home. It was another brilliant event at Stanthorpe but it was over way too fast. All the handshifters ran well and barely a tool box was opened. Our lap times were good and some new pb's were set. Plans were made to return in July to renew the battle at the Big Chill.

So.....the Big Chill is on over the weekend of the

20th and 21st of July. You can camp but it's not called the Big Chill for nothing. We stay at a motel but you need to book early as Stanthorpe's a popular tourist spot. Entries will be on ridernet and I'll put up a post on the HMRAV facebook page when they're open.

Do yourself a favour and experience these great events....you won't regret it.

P3 Speedway?

P3 SIDECARS REQUIRED!! ALSO SOLO DIRT BIKES (of any vintage including modern)

I am a member of **Speedway Sidecar Riders Association Victoria** and have been racing classic speedway sidecar for a few years after more than 50 years of sidecar road racing.

Classic speedway sidecar is so close to P3 road racing in machine and riding style, that I have to suggest you are missing a lot of one-day enjoyment relaxed fun meeting.

I have discussed with the speedway committee the inclusion of P3 road race outfits into the program and we are eager to welcome you.

I am asking you to consider this as well as, not instead of road racing.

- All meetings are one day (usually Sunday) very relaxed and friendly.
- About 8 meetings per year. All at Broadford.
- Sign in 9:30am on the day, last race about 4:00 followed by a beer and free BBQ.
- There will be 4 or 5 races / practice sessions for your class. Usually 4 laps, total each race time about 2 minutes.
- P3 road racers will have a separate class; not mixing with modern speedway outfits.
- Events will be practice and not racing if you prefer. You call what you want. There is no pressure!
- Entry fee for sidecars about \$100, plus one event licences if required. Your MA racing license is good for speedway.
- No machine modifications required, run your outfit as is, in road race trim.
- No special tyres required, run your current racing tyres or old road tyres if you wish. A wide, soft trials or mx tyre on the front will help with control, but not mandatory. No motocross knobbies allowed on the rear!!
- Your road race leathers and helmet are OK, I use motocross garments and helmet with back protector and light road boots as I find these more comfortable. Helmet and back protector are the only mandatory items.

- Your entry is by SMS to Garry Timmerman 0412 665 191 by 8:00 pm Thursday prior. Just yes or no, any other paperwork at sign in, although this may change to Ridernet, so please ring Gary earlier.
- Last meeting for this season was 21 April.
 Next season begins with practice sessions 6 & 20 October and practice / or racing 17/11 and 8/12. Please bring your bikes along and have a go!
- A lot of fun guaranteed, No extra preparation required, Please turn up.
- If you have a Dirt Bike solo in the shed, or know anyone, please bring it / them along as there is a dirt bike solo class to welcome new riders.

The club has hundreds of members with Club Permits (Red Plate) which means there are hundreds of renewals to process by members of our volunteer committee.

To ensure that your renewal application is processed, you must include the following along with your renewal notice from Vic Roads:

- You must send a photocopy of your current membership card to show that you are a FULL financial member of HMRAV (Racing and Red Plate member only Social membership does not entitle members to Red Plate privileges). This is essential and a Vic Roads requirement for red plate renewals. (In regards to family membership, It is important that each person who is part of that family membership, is known to the club and has been allocated a membership card)
- You must send a stamped, self-addressed envelope to ensure that your renewal gets back to you in a timely fashion and arrives at the right address.

Failure to adhere to these conditions will mean that we can't process your renewal and will lead to delays and frustration for all concerned.

If you have any questions please call our Club Permit coordinator Mick Chegwidden on 0401 819 609 who is only too happy to give you advice.

The Club Permit scheme is one of the great things about belonging to a club like HMRAV, so please ensure you are supporting the club by getting your renewal processes right the first time.

Please remember you need the following items for successful renewal:

- Renewal notice from Vic Roads;
- Photocopy of current HMRAV membership card;
- Stamped self-addressed envelope.
